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Getting to Know eHealth

Electronic Health Record Sharing System (eHealth)

- A government-funded, territory-wide and patientoriented electronic sharing platform in Hong Kong
- Enables two-way sharing of electronic health records (eHRs)¹ of participating patients among public and private healthcare providers (HCPs)²
- Serves as an information technology platform for public-private partnership programmes



Benefits of Joining eHealth



Patients

- Building up lifelong and more comprehensive health records for his/ her healthcare
- Receiving more timely and accurate diagnosis and treatment

HCPs

- Providing more efficient and quality-assured clinical services with health records available anytime for reference
- Minimising duplicated tests and reducing potential errors associated with paper records



Key Principles

Voluntary Participation

Need-to-know" and "Patient-under-care"



- Voluntary participation by both patients and HCPs
- Data privacy and system security protected by the eHealth Ordinance (Cap. 625)
- eHRs will only be accessed by HCPs on a "Patient-under-care" and "Need-to-know" basis with the patient's sharing consent¹
- eHealth has no direct access to the data and information of an HCP's local electronic medical record system

1 Sharing consent to the Hospital Authority (HA) and the Department of Health (DH) is taken to be given when joining eHealth

Scope of Sharable Data

- Only data falling within the pre-defined scope will be shared
- Eleven types of sharable data¹

Joining eHealth

Who can Register with eHealth as HCP?

- Participation of HCPs in eHealth is on an organisational basis
- Healthcare providing organisations with valid and eligible supporting documents as follows can register with eHealth —





Type of Establishment	Supporting Document
Private Hospital	Certificate of Registration of Private Hospital
Nursing Home	Certificate of Registration of Nursing Home
Medical Clinic	Certificate of Registration of Medical Clinic
Dental Company	Acknowledgement Letter issued by the Department of Health in receipt of "Particulars of Directors or Managers or Persons who Perform Dental Operations"
Residential Care Homes (Elderly Persons)	 Licence of Residential Care Home for the Elderly Practising Certificate of Healthcare Professional (HCProf)
Residential Care Homes (Persons with Disabilities)	 Licence of Residential Care Home for Persons with Disabilities / Certificate of Exemption of Residential Care Home for Persons with Disabilities Practising Certificate of HCProf
Specified entity that engages a registered HCProf to perform healthcare at one premises in Hong Kong (e.g. social welfare organisation)	Business Registration Certificate / Certificate of Incorporation or any other document as a proof of establishment (organisation) Practising Certificate of HCProf

Which Types of HCProfs can Access eHealth?

13 HCProf Groups¹ Specified in the eHealth Ordinance (Cap. 625) –

- Medical Practitioner (Doctor), Dentist, Midwife, Nurse, Pharmacist, Medical Laboratory Technologist, Occupational Therapist, Part I Optometrist, Radiographer, Physiotherapist, Dental Hygienist, Chiropractor and Chinese Medicine Practitioner
- To access eHealth, HCProfs with valid registration status can apply to their working HCPs for creation of eHealth accounts

HCProfs Working for Different HCPs

Access to eHealth is on an HCP (i.e. organisational) basis. If an HCProf is working for different HCPs, e.g. a doctor who is a clinic owner and also a visiting medical officer of a private hospital, he/ she needs to create HCProf accounts both at his/ her clinic and the private hospital to enable eHealth access under the two different HCPs. HCProf may contact the User Administrator (UA) of the HCP and apply for account creation at the HCP. You (HCProf) may contact eHR Registration Office for UA's contact information.



Role-based Access Control (RBAC) for HCProfs

- A privacy protection measure which controls the types of data that can be viewed by different types of HCProfs
- Pre-defined access rights are set in accordance with the clinical needs or functions of different HCProfs
- HCProfs have to provide the reason(s) and obtain patient's additional consent² before accessing eHRs which are under restricted control
- All accesses will be logged and subject to audit and inspection

What are the Technical Requirements for Joining eHealth?

View eHR Only

Basically, an eHR-compatible computer system connected to the Internet is sufficient for accessing eHealth via the eHR portal



View and Share eHR

An eHR-enabled electronic medical record (eMR) system enables both viewing and sharing of eHRs (within the eHR sharable scope and subject to the agreement of HCP) to eHealth —

(1) Government-developed eMR system

Free Clinical Management System (CMS) On-ramp is available to HCPs to support their operation and enable secure access to eHealth. For more information, please refer to the eHealth website by scanning the QR code



(2) HCPs' eMR systems

HCPs can choose to use their own eMR systems to connect to eHealth subject to compliance with the technical and security requirements as assessed by the eHR technical support team

Using eHealth

How to View a Patient's eHR?

Step 1

Log into the eHR portal or your eHR-enabled eMR system





How to View a Patient's eHR?

Step 3

Input particulars of the eHealth patient (e.g. HKIC or eHR number)¹



Step 4

Start browsing the patient's eHR²



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¹ For patient not yet completed eHR registration or given his/ her sharing consent to the HCP, the HCP needs only to complete relevant one-time procedures to access his/ her eHR (p.8 and p.9)

² Every time an HCProf accesses a patient's eHR, the patient will be notified of the access through his/ her selected communication means (SMS/ email/ post)

How to Complete Identity Verification for a Patient?

If a patient has submitted an eHealth application online or in writing (i.e. fax, email), an HCP only needs to perform the following steps to access the patient's eHR

Step 1

Ask the patient to insert his/her smart HKIC to the HKIC reader, or input his/her particulars to the system (for non-HKIC holder) and verify the patient's identity document



Step 2

Verify the patient's contact information and obtain sharing consent from him/ her in one go which serves to verify his/ her identity





Complete Identity Verification

- eHRs within the eHealth sharable scope would normally be shared to the system in around 30 minutes
- The patient will receive a confirmation notification through his/ her selected communication means (SMS/email/post)





How to Obtain Sharing Consent from a Patient?

If a patient has already registered with eHealth but has not given his/her sharing consent to an HCP, the HCP only needs to perform ANY of the following procedures to access his/her eHR -



Ask the patient to insert his/ her HKIC to the HKIC reader



Enter the patient's 8-digit Access Key to eHealth




Advise the patient to use eHealth App to give sharing consent



Obtain the patient's signed **Sharing Consent Form (Available** at the eHealth website)



Advise the patient to call the 24hour Interactive Voice Response System (3467 6300) to give sharing consent



Protecting Data Privacy in eHealth

Patients' information in eHealth is protected by the eHealth Ordinance (Cap. 625) and the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance (Cap. 486) (PDPO)



eHealth participating HCPs should act in accordance with requirements under the eHealth Ordinance and PDPO when handling patients' eHRs in eHealth

Points to Note on Privacy Protection in eHealth

eHealth User

Ensure only authorised HCProfs can access patients' eHRs and remind all authorised users not to share their accounts

Account

Make sure patients have read the "Participant Information Notice" and the "Personal Information Collection Statement" before they give joining or sharing consent

Patient's Participation

Access to eHRs

Remind your HCProfs to access only the eHRs relevant to the services they provide on a "Need-to-know" basis

Personal Data Privacy Policy

Review and update your existing personal data privacy policies to ensure compliance with relevant regulatory requirements

Data **Security**

Adopt all reasonably practicable steps to protect personal data in eHealth and report to the eHR Office all suspected/ detected incidents

Data Accuracy

Ensure the records you share are accurate and comply with the sharing requirements

Withdrawing from eHealth

- A registered HCP can withdraw from eHealth at any time
- A registered HCP should withdraw its registration if it no longer fulfils the registration requirement¹ (e.g. termination of business)
